


Eyes on Slokan Lake - Biodiversity Mapping Project




Eyes on Slokan Lake is a new citizen science project developed by the Slokan Lake Stewardship Society and the Selkirk Geospatial Research Centre to inspire local residents and visitors to explore and capture sightings of biodiversity within the Slokan Lake watershed of southeastern British Columbia. Eyes on Slokan Lake was initiated in the summer of 2014, during which people of all ages collected observations of nature using smartphones and digital cameras, and then uploaded their photos to iNaturalist.org. By fall 2015 we hope to have documented hundreds of interesting observations throughout our watershed, to expand our knowledge of the amazing creatures and plants living in and around Slokan Lake.




